HOPE SCHOLARSHIPS: This a scholarship for everyone who is beginning their post high school education: The Hope Scholarship (federal) allows eligible students pursuing the first two years of postsecondary education to receive a federal tax credit for 100 percent of the first \$1,000 of tuition and fees and 50 percent of the second \$1,000 on their federal income tax. That's \$1,000 off your tax bill the first year and \$500 off the second. The credit is adjusted for inflation.
