Knight Time is Purposeful-Make the Most of Your Time

Knight Time is.....

1. An individualized opportunity for students to gain academic assistance, support, and enrichment in particular subject and content areas.
2. A streamlined opportunity for students to make-up work, redo assignments, and make revisions to assignments per teacher directions.
 - a. Students can also complete work and assignments in a teacher's classroom. However, they should be working quietly on their assignments and not interrupting students getting extra assistance.
3. An opportunity for students with significant time constraints, obligations, and transportation issues to participate in school-based organizations and clubs and to better prepare for local, state, regional, and national competitions in which these organizations will be encouraged to participate.
4. An opportunity for students in Advanced Placement classes to have intensive preparation sessions prior to the AP Exam in May.
5. An opportunity for students to use computers for research and other academic reasons. There are three available labs: E105, C105, and C109
6. To assist students with the completion of papers and other projects on certain days in the writing lab available. Refer to the matrix.
7. An opportunity to get assistance from the Office of School Counseling with the college application process in room D108.



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How Students Plan for Knight Time

Students should plan for Knight Time by.....

1. Communicating with their teachers every class to get important information on their grades and academic standing.
2. Reviewing the Knight Time Matrix so that students can create a weekly plan by coordinating their academic needs with teacher and subject-specific availability.
3. Reviewing the listing and description of the clubs, organizations, and other activities that are available for students and to coordinate their participation and involvement in these activities.
4. Signing up for subject-specific assistance and make up work opportunities 1-3 days in advance so that the teacher knows that the student is coming and can plan accordingly to assist the student.
5. Understanding that teacher distribution of make-up work or missing assignments after an absence will be done through Knight Time.

Knight Time: Procedures and Expectations for Students

Arrival Times: Students enter the building at 6:55am and have 10 minutes to get to their Knight Time location.

Knight Time begins at 7:05 A.M.

1. Students who arrive before 7:05 will report to an academic support room or club of their choice. They must be in a room by 7:10, when the late bell rings. Students found in the hallways after the 7:10 bell without a pass will be escorted to the detention room and additional consequences may follow.
2. Students arriving through the main entrance after 7:10, but before 7:17 A.M. will be given an excused pass to a classroom of their choice.
3. Students arriving after 7:17 will be marked tardy and will report to the cafeteria to wait for first period. They will not be permitted to walk the halls or to enter a Knight Time Location



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once Knight Time has started. Excessive tardiness may result in disciplinary action and risk earning an unsatisfactory for the seminar class.

4. Students arriving in the morning, prior to 7:10 should be in one of the following locations by 7:10 AM:
 - a. A Knight Time Class that they have identified on their plan or coordinated verbally with a teacher for the purpose of receiving academic assistance, extra academic support, academic enrichment activities, making up missed assignments, redoing assignments, or making corrections on an assignment.
 - b. A Knight Time Organization or Club location where they can contribute to the development, activities, and success of the organization's mission and purpose.
 - c. One of the other available alternative areas within the building including the Career & College Center, Study Hall (Cafeteria and Media), Computer Lab, or the Writing Lab.
5. Students who arrive on campus by bus, driving, or who are dropped off, are not permitted to leave campus. Students who leave campus or who do not directly report inside the school building will face disciplinary consequences.
6. Students who are transported to school by car (i.e., parent drop off) and who arrive after 7:17 should be dropped off in the front of the school across from the main entrance. The side door on the teacher parking lot side will be locked at 7:17.
7. Students cannot move from one class to another during Knight Time. Once they are in a location, they must remain there for the duration of Knight Time.
8. The bell will ring at 7:50 AM for the students to report to 1st period. All students should be in their 1st period class by 7:55 AM.
9. Students who do not effectively utilize Knight Time to improve their academic performance may receive a required schedule of interventions.
10. Teachers may frequently assign a student to their Knight Time if that student has been absent, is missing work, or has poor academic performance in their class.



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Knight Time: What Students and Parents Should Know

1. Students who do not effectively utilize Knight Time to improve their academic performance may receive a required schedule of interventions.
2. No make-up work, missed / redo assignments, or extra credit opportunities for a given marking period will be provided to students after the last day of the marking period.
3. Regular class time will be completely focused on instruction. This will not be the time for students to makeup assignments, get make-up or missed assignments, etc.
4. Students will always be encouraged by teachers to take advantage of Knight Time opportunities. Also, teachers may frequently assign a student to their Knight Time if that student has been absent, is missing work, or has poor academic performance in their class.
5. The faculty and staff of North County High School will provide opportunities, support, and assistance to help students be successful. Students who do not take advantage or utilize these offerings and who have poor academic performance and lack of involvement at North County High School truly have no excuses. Maximum student effort and student utilization of resources will factor heavily into their success at North County High School
