

General Information:

You are required to arrive no later than 30 minutes prior to your exam: **7:15 a.m.** for the morning administration and **11:30 a.m.** for the afternoon administration. Students arriving late to an exam will not be permitted to take it. The amount paid for the exam will be forfeited.

Students taking two exams on the same day **MUST** bring their lunch as there will not be enough time between exams to buy lunch.

The length of AP exams varies by subject. Exams take approximately three hours of actual testing time. Additional time is needed to distribute, collect, and count exams. There is a ten-minute break between sections. Morning exams end around 11:45 a.m. and afternoon exams end around 4:00 p.m.

Students may not be dismissed until an exam has officially ended; do not ask to leave early if you finish before the end of the exam. Most afternoon exams will not end until 4:00 p.m. Students will not be provided bus transportation beyond the regular daily bus schedule. Students who play a sport or have a job are responsible for informing coaches or employers of AP Exam obligation. Arrangements should be made by the student **before the exam.**

Cell phones will be collected at the beginning of testing. If you do not want your phone collected, please do not bring it with you.

Late exams (after the testing window) will be administered for those students with an excused absence (illness) or exam conflict. If a late exam is required without a valid excuse, a late fee of \$45 will be required.

You should bring the following items to the exam room:

- Several sharpened No. 2 pencils (with erasers) for completing multiple-choice answer sheets
- Black or dark-blue ballpoint pens for completing areas on the exam booklet covers and for free-response questions in most exams
- A valid photo I.D.
- A sweater, in case the room temperature is below your comfort level
- A watch without an alarm (in case the exam room does not have a clock that you can see easily)
- A calculator with the necessary capabilities that complies with the College Board Calculator Policy (if you are taking Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Physics, or Statistics) (Visit www.collegeboard.com/ap/calculators to learn more about the calculator policy for each of these exams, and for a list of authorized calculators.) You are advised to bring a second calculator and/or replacement batteries to the exam.
- A ruler or straightedge (if you are taking an AP Physics Exam)
- Your social security number for identification purposes (optional). If you provide it, the number will appear on your AP score reports.
- Your College Board SSD Accommodations Letter if you are taking an exam with approved testing accommodations

You should not bring the following items to the exam room:

- Cell phones, digital cameras, personal digital assistants (PDAs), BlackBerry smartphones, Bluetooth-enabled devices, MP3 players, e-mail/messaging devices, or any other electronic or communication devices
- Backpacks, books, compasses, mechanical pencils, colored pencils, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, or notes
- Rulers and straightedges (except if taking one of the Physics exams)
- Scratch paper (notes can be made on portions of the exam booklets)
- Computers (students with a computer accommodation will use a school machine)
- Calculators (except if taking Calculus, Chemistry, Physics, and/or Statistics)
- Reference guides, keyboard maps, or other typing instructions
- Watches that beep or have an alarm
- Portable listening or recording devices (even with headphones) or photographic equipment
- Food or drink (unless taking two exams on one day)
- Clothing with subject-related information

Students are required to abide by the policies of both the College Board and North County High School during the exam period. Any misconduct will be reported and could jeopardize your AP Exam score. **YOU WILL INCUR AN OBLIGATION FOR \$15 IF AN EXAM WAS ORDERED ON YOUR BEHALF AND YOU DO NOT TAKE IT.**

Get a good night's rest before your exam, and eat a nutritious breakfast. Please complete the permission slip for early dismissal/late arrival during any exam day. **It must be completed and turned in prior to the beginning of exams.**
